

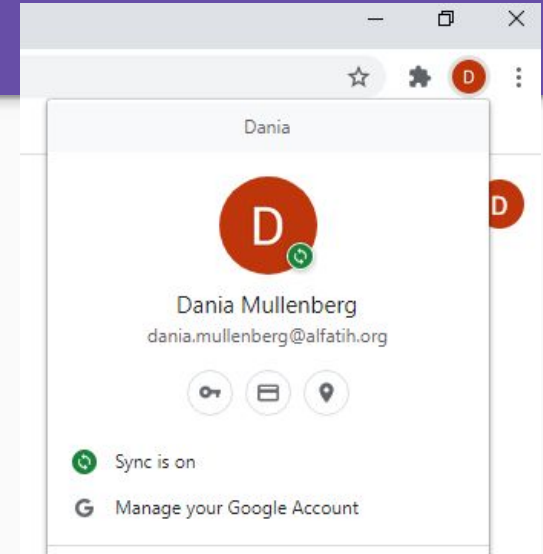

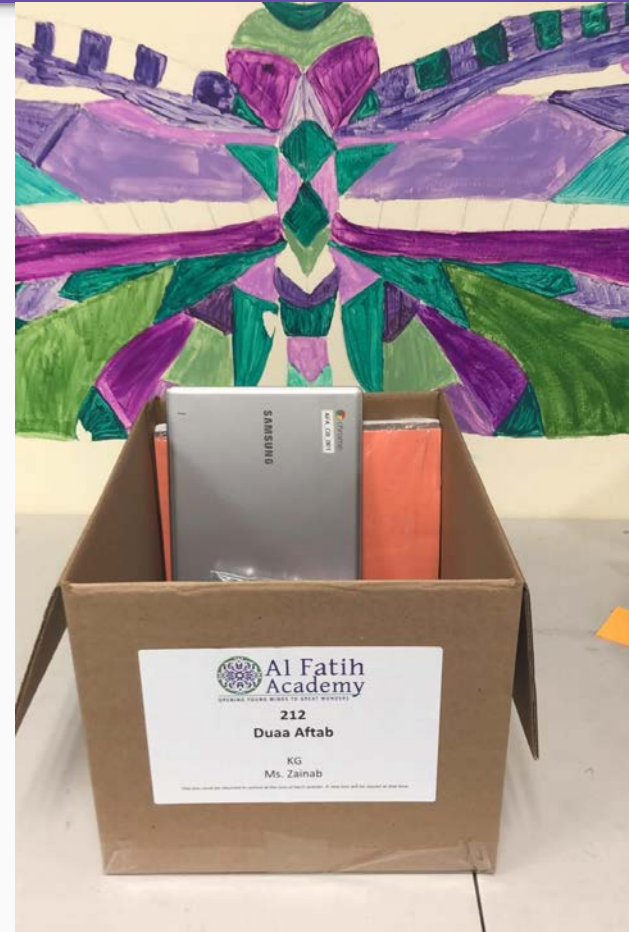
Online Platform: GSuite for Education

- Email administered to every student, grades K-8
 - allows for student/parent to access/house AFA-only related emails, resources, communications.
- School-managed bookmark bar
- Reminder: if using personal device, students must use Google Chrome and it must be logged into their AFA account
 - Note: AFA is not able to access any personal files on a personal device



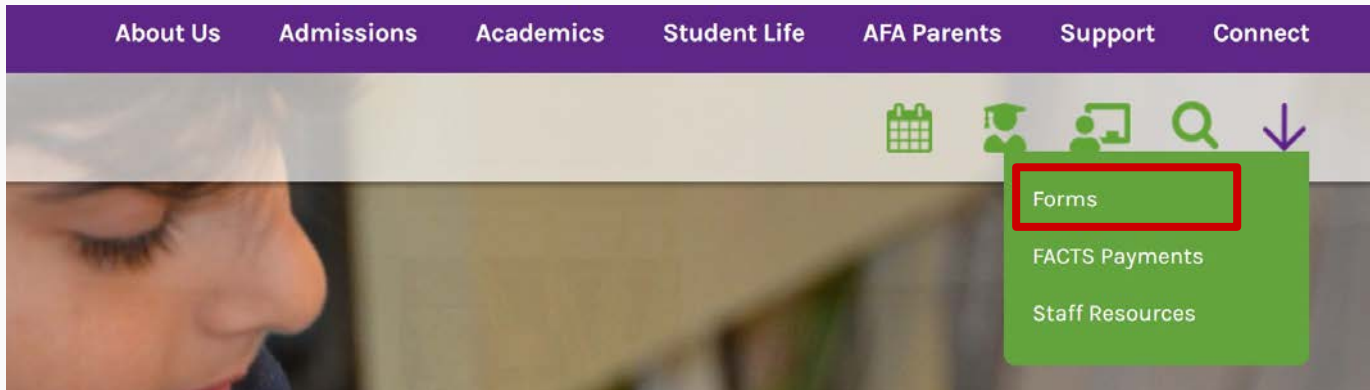
Student Learning Kits - Reminders

- Kits include a variety of materials
- Periodically check on supply levels
- Make sure supplies only used for school work
- Take care of any textbooks given to students
- May need to help students with preparation of materials for classes
- Keep box in a safe place to be returned at next pick-up event



Attending Live Sessions

- Teachers will record attendance for every live session in RenWeb
 - Attendance during homeroom is counted as official daily attendance
 - Students are marked tardy if joining more than 2 minutes late
 - Parents will be contacted if tardiness is persistent
 - Students expected to stay for the entire live session
- Absences must be reported by parents - posted on AFA website

Grading Policy

- Assignments are graded in Virtual School
- Middle School utilizes A-U Grading Scale
- Breakdown:
 - Homework = 10%
 - Assessments = 35%
 - Classwork = 55%
- Retake Policy
 - Earning C or lower on assessment → Retake is possible
 - Student must have completed assignments before test to be eligible
 - Teacher discretion for retake if grade earned is 76%+
 - No retake grade will exceed 90%

Independent Work Time & Office Hours

- Independent Work Time is for school work
- Students should be working on their assignments, studying, reading, etc.
- Students should email their teachers for specific help if needed
- Tuesday - Thursday - Office Hours from 3-3:45 pm for MS Core Subjects
- Friday Office Hours for Arabic/Quran Teachers
- Students/parents/teachers can request office hour meeting time

Communication Expectations

- **Teachers/Staff**

- Mon-Fri, teachers will respond within 24 hrs between 8-4pm
- Teachers send weekly newsletter on Sunday to help prep for following week
- Emails received on the weekend by teachers will be responded to on Monday
- Teachers/staff should only be reached by their official AFA emails
- Admin may send reminders outside of school hours on a limited basis

Goals of the Quran Program

 - أدعية (*Duas*) related to daily lives
 - أحاديث (*Narrations*) related to worship & interactions



Goals of the Arabic Program

- Emphasize strategies that allow students to see themselves as language learners.
- Emphasis on reading, writing, listening and speaking through Arabic Immersion.
- Incorporate vocabulary, grammar and dialogue in discovering cultural experiences.
- Participation in plays, dialogues, and games to apply learned vocabulary.

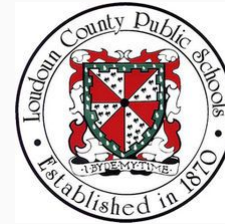

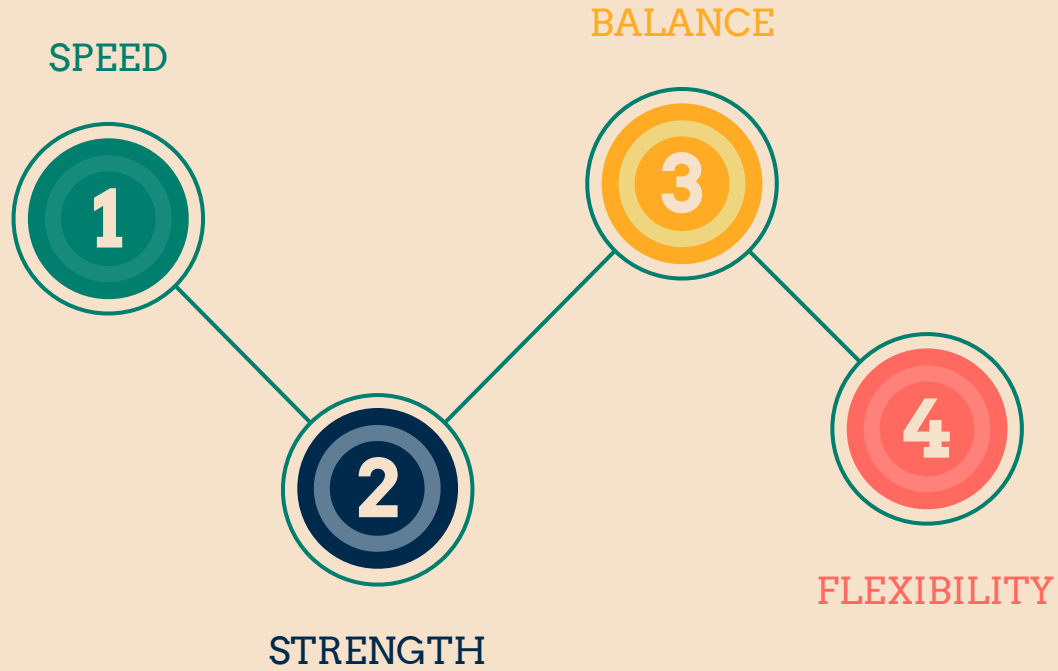

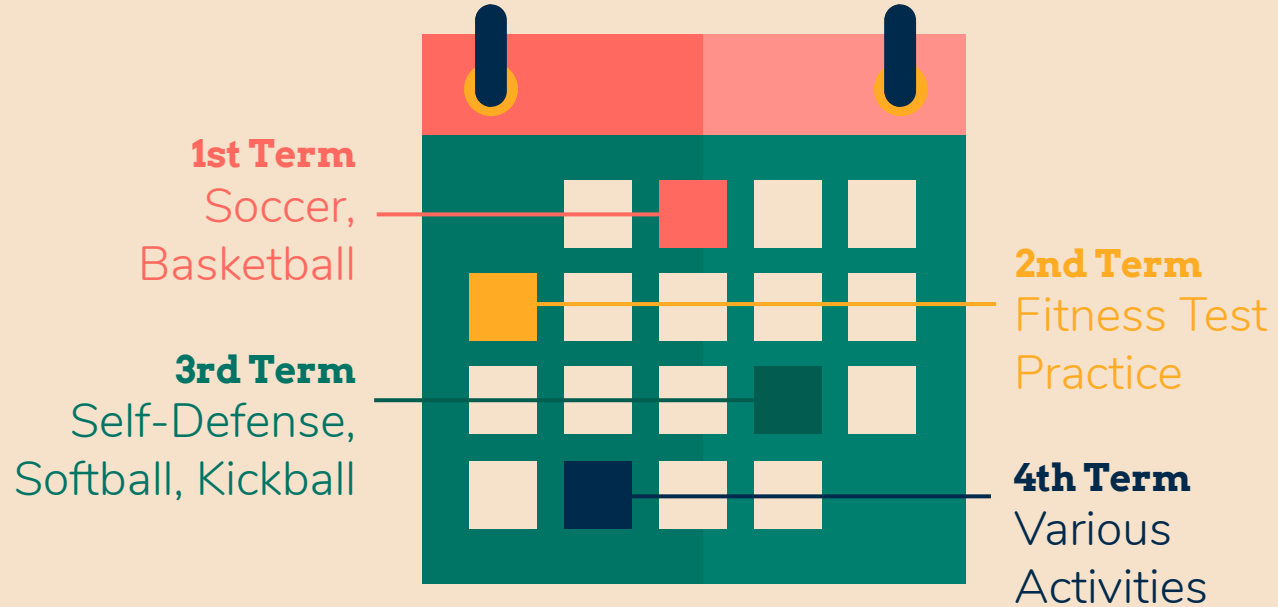

5 TIPS FOR PARENTS TO FACILITATE VIRTUAL LEARNING



Routines are EVERYTHING

Help your child establish and stick to a routine. Example:

- Wake up, eat breakfast and change
- Organized and well-stocked workspace
- Packed lunch and snacks
- Planned virtual play dates for socializing after school and weekends



Check In with Teachers and Counselors

Check in if your child is having difficulty managing the online learning platform or staying on task.

Be on the lookout for any communications from teachers indicating that they are having trouble connecting with your child during this time.



Get Moving!

Your child will be sitting in front of their computer for long stretches of time. Encourage them to use the breaks in the day to stretch, go for a walk, or do jumping jacks — any movement helps!

Try not to let your child to log in early to class - use break time to take a real break.



It's Their Learning Time

Resist the urge to sit in on classes with your child. While it may certainly be tempting to "pop in" on your child's classes, please respect their privacy and that of other students.



Take Care of YOU

The famous saying, "You can't pour from an empty cup" holds true. If you're not taking care of your own physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs, you will have less energy, space, and patience to connect with and take care of your children. Even 10-15 minutes of scheduled "me" time during the day is beneficial.
